Direction by the Lichfield District Council under Article 4(3)(b) of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1977

Statement by the Local Planning Authority

1. The Direction:

The Lichfield District Council have resolved to make a Direction under Article 4(3)(b) of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1977 whereby the permission granted by Article 3 of the Order shall not apply to development within Class II(3) of Schedule 1 comprising the painting of the exterior of any building or work which is not included in the statutory list of buildings of special architectural or historic interest.

2. The Extent of the Direction:

The District Council considers that the area which ought to be the subject of the Direction should, for the main part, form the designated conservation area of Lichfield together with that part of George Lane adjacent to the conservation area and bounded by a red line on the plan annexed to the Direction. The following main streets together with minor lanes and alleyways are covered by the Direction:-

Beacon Street Bird Street Bore Street Breadmarket Street Cathedral Close Church Street Conduit Street Dam Street Frog Lane Gaia Lane George Lane Lombard Street Market Street Quonians Lane St. John Street Shaw Lane Tamworth Street

The Location and Character of the Area:

Lichfield was designated a conservation area in February, 1970 in accordance with the provisions of the Civic Amenities Act, 1967 which was subsequently amended and repealed by the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971.
