Chompy only eats leftovers when they go in the **food waste caddy**.


When scraps go in the wrong place, his tummy rumbles.

Albert had knowledge.


Lennie had joy.

you help Lichfield District,


you help Tamworth,


Chompy (call & response)

Food waste goes where recycling acts!




Ruby Recycling Queen
