Top tips for business owners and managers

How to draw up an emergency evacuation plan

Things to think about when developing your plan:

- How will to make sure your staff all know about your plan.
- Make sure your staff know where the designated assembly points are, both in and out of the city.
- How you will alert your, visitors and shoppers about the need to evacuate, and where the assembly points are.
- Whether your staff can reach the chosen assembly point.
- How you will help staff, visitors and shoppers with physical or visual disabilities during an evacuation.
- Develop a plan for how you will account for all your staff at the assembly point.
- Explain how you will communicate with your staff when they arrive at the assembly point and afterwards.

Remember you should regularly practice your evacuation plan to ensure all employees are familiar with it!



If you are asked to stay indoors

- Keep doors and windows closed.
- Move away from windows.
- Turn off air conditioning.
- Find a safe place inside such as a corridor or a windowless room.
- Tune in to local tv and radio.
- Make sure a telephone is close to hand (be aware mobile telephones may not work).

If you are asked to evacuate from an area

- Leave immediately.
- Implement any building evacuation plans.
- Close all doors behind you.
- Help others and inform those who do not appear to be responding to the evacuation.
- Use security personnel or nominated staff to escort people from buildings to the evacuation area.
- Follow police instructions and advice and listen to the information on where to go.
