Physical Quality Score

1.1 The following assessment score sheet is derived from 'Assessing Needs and Opportunities'. This scoring system has been used on previous versions of the Open Space Assessment, and is used again to provide continuity between the old and current Assessments. As was described within the main document this assessment has been altered slightly with each site now being assessed against it's maximum potential with a final score given as a percentage. This has made all sites comparable with sites not scoring poorly where certain elements of the scoring may not have been applicable.

1.2 The methodology for assessing the 'play value' of areas of equipped play is included within the Children & Young People's chapter of the main document. This element of quality scoring is new to this document and uses a series of criteria devised from consultation for the play strategy and is designed to consider the quality of play at each site. In a similar manner to the physical quality scoring each site has been scored and given a potential maximum score to which the site should aspire. Each Criteria can score up to 100%, however where a certain criteria may not be 100% applicable to a particular site

4 Summary of Consultation

4.1 The following section provides details of some of the consultations that have taken place and have informed this Open Space Assessment.

Citizens Questionnaire August 2011

4.2 The citizens questionnaire was completed by over 400 residents of the District and included a series of questions to gauge satisfaction with leisure facilities and open spaces across the District.

- 84% of respondents are very or fairly satisfied with parks and open space facilities within the District.
- On the whole residents of Burntwood are less satisfied with the provision of open space in their area than Lichfield City and the wider rural areas.
- The survey found that the main use of parks and open spaces within the District is for 'fresh air' and 'walking'. The survey also found that 81% of residents had visited a park or open space within the District in the last 6 months, with those with children visiting parks more regularly.
- Beacon Park in Lichfield is the most regularly used park and is used by residents from across the entire district.
- All areas of the District expressed a need for an increase in allotment provision.
- Burntwood residents were less satisfied with the provision of parks and gardens, spaces for children and amenity green space that residents of Lichfield City or the wider rural areas.

Green & Open Spaces Strategy

4.3 In July and December 2007 an information gathering exercise was undertaken by Lichfield District Council using the input of active voluntary and community groups who have a keen interest in the way that potential sustainable transport corridors could be developed. This exercise assists in exploring new and joint opportunities to protect, enhance or develop sustainable corridors of transport, access and biodiversity. Maps were used so the groups could identify where they regularly walk or cycle, or undertake relevant nature or heritage conservation work.

- Those invited to take part in the information gathering exercise raised the following issues (for full list see Technical Appendices Document):
- The construction of a bridge across the A38 to link route 54 to the National Memorial Arboretum (NMA).
- Access to Fradley Industrial Estate from National Cycle Network (NCN) 54 along Wood End Lane.
- Access between Croxall and the NMA is poor and there is demand for better linkages. The A513 bridge is very dangerous.
- Whitemoor Haye is important for breeding and wintering birds including Corn Bunting.
- In Hopwas Wood accessible and non-accessible areas are poorly defined and as a valuable open space it is poorly developed.

- Link 'Green Pipe' Rawnsley to Chasewater across open cast workings and crossing over Heath Hayes Road.
- The Recreation Zone at Darwin Park needs to be reserved as one.
- Railway formation to link Lichfield to Chasewater for walking / cycling.
- Canal restoration route will have community benefits.
- Work with RSPB to promote access to new Middleton Hall site and links with Kingsbury Water Park.

Lichfield District Play Strategy -'Who told us?'

4.4 The preparation of the Lichfield District Play Strategy involved gathering the views of children. The section below sets out the opinions gathered from this consultation.

4.5 The School Councils told us a lot about the difficulties children have whilst playing outdoors. For most children there were many barriers to outside play.

- **Chase Terrace**: The children said they like to play outside, but the play areas are too far away from where they live.
- **Mile Oak**: Children don't feel safe because there are too many teenagers hanging around who bully them, drive fast in cars, and hang around the community centre drinking and taking drugs. There are police about every night. If they play near home, neighbours complain about the noise and the balls going into their gardens. The play area by the community centre is damaged and boring. It only has one swing working.
- **Handsacre**: There is a good play area in Armitage, but it is too far away, across a busy road. The local play area is very run down. Teenagers drink there and break glass bottles, so it is not safe to play.
- **Chasetown**: The main park is across a busy main road, so the children can't go by themselves. The play area is boring and not looked after, so they don't like using it. Lots of the children did not live near a park. Some play on a traffic island.
- **North Lichfield**: Most of the children did not have a play area near their home. The roads are busy and this makes it difficult to walk to the play areas further away. Neighbours complain if they play in the street. They don't feel safe playing out.
- **Queens Croft**: Young people make friends at school and then have to go home on a bus and can't meet their friends outside school. Concerns were expressed about not feeling safe, having no-one to play with. They said they are often not allowed to go out to play by their parents.
- Nether Stowe High School: Some young people said they had no friends who lived nearby. If they meet their friends they get moved on from the local shop, even though they are not doing anything wrong. There is nowhere to go in town without going into cafes which cost too much and there is nowhere to hang about in their local area. Some of the young people didn't feel safe and had experienced bullying. Some experience transport difficulties because they live in villages. They felt that many of the play areas were full of rubbish and glass and that the benches in Beacon Park were scruffy and broken. Friary Grange Leisure Centre has too many rules and restrictions for the swimming pool, so they can't enjoy swimming, the changing areas are unhygienic. They said the refreshment area was dirty and always had used plastic cups on the tables and they were unable to get hot food, unlike at the café at Burntwood Leisure Centre.

- **Chase Terrace**: Children wanted more play areas near where they live. They wanted more things they like to do at the play areas, different equipment which was more fun.
- Mile Oak: They want their play area to have good equipment like in Beacon Park. They
 would like an all-weather surface. More litter bins to keep the play area clean and
 somebody to look after it properly. Somewhere for the teenagers to go and hang out.
 They want things for teenagers to do, so that they don't spoil their play area or bully
 them.
- **Hayes Meadow**: Someone to look after their play area and keep it clean and tidy. An all-weather surface. A bike park so they can have somewhere just to ride bikes. Something for teenagers to do.
- **Springhill**: Play areas closer to home and better looked after equipment.
- North Lichfield: Children want us to keep the green spaces and they want more play areas. Water fountains in parks and playgrounds because they get hot and thirsty when they play. More litter bins to help keep the play areas clean and tidy. Playgrounds which aren't near main roads, so they are safe to get to.
- **Queens Croft**: The children wanted more playschemes and activities in holidays and more sports clubs that they can go to.
- Nether Stowe High School: They wanted somewhere to hang out, but not necessarily to take part in activities. Over half thought teen shelters were a good idea, or else a youth pod, which would be warmer and dryer. One council member had used a pod in Rugeley and it was very well used. They wanted more fields for sports and play areas to be looked after. The Enots play area was mentioned by a number of members, who wanted it improving. Just over half the members supported the idea of a skate park in Lichfield. Members who live in surrounding villages such as Armitage and Handsacre, mentioned transport difficulties and said they wanted a skate park as well. They want hot food facilities, like the ones offered at Burntwood Leisure Centre at Friary Grange Leisure Centre and cleaner changing rooms and café. They offered new ideas for the summer programme, including paintballing and weekend camps, they also suggested new ways to market the programme.
- Results of the Summer Programme consultation
 - The children's favourite play activity was playing outdoors, including football and other sports.
 - Nearly two out of ten children said they did not play outside their home, on their own, without an adult.
 - However, 99% of children thought it was important to have somewhere safe to play outside. Over half thought it was very important.
 - The most popular outdoor activity was football and riding bikes. The most popular indoor activity was watching television and playing on the computer.
 - Top of the poll for better play opportunities was better outdoor play areas and more sports facilities.
- Results of the Parent's Questionnaires
 - We received 121 responses:
 - 85% felt strongly that every community should have an outdoor play area.

- 80% are happy with the summer playscheme opening times.
- Parents were asked which age group has the greatest need for new play services and facilities. The results were:
- 0 4 years 7%
- 5 9 years 36%
- 10 -13 years 39%
- 14 -18 years 19%

Lichfield City Centre Parks Household Survey

4.6 The survey was produced in April 2005 as part of a Heritage Lottery Fund Bid for the restoration of Stowe Pool and its open space, Minster Pool and Walk, The Garden of Remembrance, Museum Gardens and Beacon Park and The Close. As part of this bid it was important to determine an accurate picture of who uses Lichfield City Centre parks.

- 4.7 The results of this questionnaire are as follows:
- The most used greenspace in Lichfield City is Beacon Park and Museum Gardens;
- The least used is the Garden of Remembrance;
- Most people visit the parks and greenspace on their own;
- The least amount of visits are with children;
- Most people walk to parks and green spaces in the city;
- Bus is the least popular method of transport to the parks;
- Most people stay at parks and green spaces in Lichfield City for up to an hour;
- Respondents believe that the parks and green spaces are of good quality although Stowe Pool was the least rated;
- The most popular improvements that people would like to see through the planned works are to site furniture (benches, bins), wildlife, lighting and floral displays;
- Respondents indicated that the reasons they don't visit the parks more often is due to a lack of time, vandalism, dog fouling, antisocial behaviour and they don't feel safe at the sites;
- Those who said they didn't feel safe stated this was mainly due to young people hanging around and drinking.

Parish Council Open Space Questionnaire

4.8 In 2004 Lichfield District Council undertook a survey of Parish Councils to assess their open space provision. This survey considered which sites were owned by the parishes and whether there was a deficiency of open space or not.

4.9 12 Parish Councils replied to the open space questionnaire regarding 19 separate settlements. The Parish Councils that replied identified four settlements in the District that had a deficiency in the quantity of open space. These were:

- Shenstone;
- Upper Longdon;

- Whittington;
- Lichfield.

4.10 There were also eight with a deficiency in a specific type of open space:

- Kings Bromley;
- Hill Ridware;
- Shenstone;
- Longdon;
- Upper Longdon;
- Edingale;
- Whittington;
- Lichfield.

4.11 The types of open space with a deficiency that were specifically mentioned by the Parish Councils are:

- Playing fields and sports pitches at Shenstone and Whittington;
- Play areas within Longdon and Shenstone;
- Allotments within Lichfield and Shenstone;
- Safe cycle areas at Hopwas;
- Facilities for older children and teenagers within Kings Bromley and Hill Ridware;
- Lichfield City Council specified a need for a skate park.

4.12 Further to this, seven of the settlements were said to be deficient in play equipment. They were:

- Kings Bromley;
- Hill Ridware;
- Upper Longdon;
- Edingale;
- Whittington;
- Burntwood;
- Lichfield.

4.13 Seven of the settlements were noted to have some low accessibility to the open space. They were:

- Pipe Ridware;
- Hill Ridware;
- Hopwas;
- Shenstone;
- Whittington;
- Burntwood;
- Lichfield.

4.14 Two settlements were identified as having some poor quality open space; these were Hill Ridware and Lichfield.

General Household Satisfaction Survey

4.15 This survey was undertaken by Lichfield District Council in 2006 as part of the Government's Best Value Initiatives. The broad objective of this study is to examine the levels of satisfaction amongst local residents with the services they receive from Lichfield District Council. At the same time, the survey is also used to collect basic demographic and social profiles of the local population.

4.16 Parts of this survey relate to parks and open spaces and people's perception of them. It also asked the respondent questions on litter and how this is dealt with by Lichfield District Council. The survey found:

- Almost 75% of respondents are satisfied that the Council had fulfilled its duty to keep land clear of litter and refuse, whilst only 10.2% said they were dissatisfied;
- The majority of residents (86%) are users of local parks, open spaces and play areas. Over half (53.5%) are regular monthly users. Younger residents are significantly more likely to be users;
- Parks and open spaces are particularly well rated by local residents;
- Access to nature, parks and open spaces are the only features seen to have improved over the past three years.

Chase Terrace Environmental Improvements

4.17 The study was conducted in September 2007 as part of an exhibition to gather people's opinions on proposals for the area.

4.18 This survey concentrated on the areas of Larks Rise, Ironstone Road, Kingsdown Road and Balmoral Way. In Larks Rise the majority of people supported the proposals for:

- Dog bins
- New footpaths
- Tree thinning
- Scrub clearance
- Mowed area for play

4.19 However, the majority of people did not welcome the proposal for more goals as they suggested it would encourage noise and disturbance.

4.20 All those who responded to proposals for Ironstone Road supported the proposal for a heather habitat, dog bins and tree planting.

4.21 At Kingsdown Road there was majority support for dog bins, a new path, tree thinning and informal seating.

4.22 The proposal for shrub and tree planting at Balmoral Way got the full support of respondents.

4.23 It is intended that a small area of play for children up to the age of 12 is to be developed at the Larks Rise site. Respondents gave a mixed response to this proposal and cited the fear of antisocial behaviour and vandalism as reasons for not wanting the play area.

Greens & Open Spaces Summary Document Scoping Questions

4.24 These questions were linked to the Greens and Open Spaces Strategy Summary Document and concerned issues such as the respondents' interest in open spaces and any specific types of open space they would like addressed in the Strategy.

4.25 Nature of interest in Green and Open Spaces?

• The most common nature of interest is use of the space for informal leisure and recreation. Use by sporting organisations is infrequent.

4.26 What are the five most important benefits in developing a Greens and Open Spaces Strategy?

- Over 80% of respondents expressed that protection of the environment is one of the five most important benefits from developing a Greens and Open Spaces Strategy and three-quarters stated alternative walking and cycling networks. Reinforcement of local identity is deemed the least important benefit;
- Other benefits specified include: appropriate protection, enhanced biodiversity, linking to management plan provisions to extend visitor potential surrounding the AONB, and keeping areas of green space.

4.27 Are there any specific types of green spaces you would like to see addressed by the Strategy?

• Half of respondents said that they would like to see specific types of green spaces addressed by the Strategy. Suggestions include: parks, specific dog walking areas, canals, sports pitches, local woodland, access links, equity of provision and protection.

4.28 In addition one-third of respondents indicated that cleanliness of parks and open spaces is the most important element to be included in the Strategy. An equal percentage of respondents attached highest importance to access and provision of open space.

Open Space, Sport & Recreation Household Survey

4.29 This questionnaire was developed to ascertain the views of a random selection of the District population on issues concerning open spaces and their level of use. This includes their method of transport and distance travelled.

4.30 The majority of respondents to this questionnaire agree that there is a park or open space within easy walking distance from their home.

4.31 When asked if they were happy with the facilities that are available in their nearest park the most popular response was in the 'agreement' section although there were large numbers of people who 'disagreed' or 'disagreed strongly'. Those people who 'disagreed' or 'strongly disagreed' with this statement highlighted the following areas as being inadequate:

- Burntwood Burntwood Park, Redwood Park, Chase Terrace Park;
- Lichfield Beacon Park, Darnford Park, Shortbutts Lane;
- Alrewas;

- Fazeley and Mile Oak;
- Armitage with Handsacre;
- Fradley;
- Clifton Campville.

4.32 When asked if they can easily get to other parks or open spaces that provide facilities they need the most popular response was 'agree', however there was still a large number of respondents who stated 'disagree' or 'strongly disagree'.

4.33 Respondents were asked if it is easy to find out about parks and open spaces and facilities they provide. Their responses were closely split between 'agree' and 'disagree'.

4.34 Nearly 80% of respondents agreed that improving off-road footpaths and cycle routes would encourage them to walk or cycle.

4.35 Approximately two-thirds of respondents use the park or open space closest to their home most often. One-third use a different park or open space further away from home.

4.36 Most people travel to the park or open space they use most often by foot. Travelling by car is also a popular mode of transport. Over 60% of journeys take up to 10 minutes with an additional 20% taking up to 15 minutes. For journeys that take less than 5 minutes the main mode of transport is by foot, followed by cycling and then car. The main mode of transport for journeys between 5 and 10 minutes is by foot, followed by car and then cycling. For journeys between 11-15 minutes the main mode of transport is by car, followed by foot and then bicycle.

Omnibus Survey

4.37 This survey was conducted in August 2007 over a two week period by an external agency through face to face interviews at randomly selected properties within Lichfield District. This survey shows results against previous Omnibus Surveys conducted at the same time in previous years. 299 interviews were conducted and were split between Burntwood (78), Lichfield (103) and Rural (118).

4.38 Satisfaction with parks and open spaces is quite high at 73% of all respondents, which includes 20% who are very satisfied.

4.39 While the majority (77%) of respondents providing a response feel that parks and open spaces have stayed the same over the last 12 months, the proportion feeling they have improved (11%) is greater than the proportion (2%) that feel they have deteriorated.

4.40 Frequency of use of parks and open spaces:

- More than eight in ten (85%) respondents reported that they have visited a park or open space in the last twelve months, including more than half of these (54%) who reported at least weekly use;
- The majority of respondents use parks and open spaces to walk (76%), for fresh air (39%), to walk dogs (26%) and/or to exercise (22%).

4.41 Satisfaction with parks and open spaces:

- Amongst users, almost two-thirds (86%) are satisfied to a degree, including 23% who are very satisfied. This compares positively with just over one in ten (12%) who are indifferent and 2% who have expressed a level of dissatisfaction;
- The level of user satisfaction with parks and open spaces at 86% is the same as that returned in July 2005 after a 4 percentage point increase from July 2004;
- There is no significant variation by area although respondents living in the rural areas are most satisfied with parks and open spaces.

4.42 Provision of different types of open space:

4.43 Respondents were provided with a list of eight types of open space and asked to state whether they feel there is enough or not enough provisions for each within the local area:

- About one in four respondents are indicating that there are not enough spaces for children and young people (25%) or outdoor sporting facilities (22%);
- Respondents living in the Burntwood areas are more likely to feel that there are not enough spaces for children and young people. They are also more likely to feel that there are not enough outdoor sporting facilities.

4.44 Respondents were then asked how long they think they should expect to travel to each type of open space and also the mode of transport they would expect to use:

- In terms of the time one would expect to travel, respondents would, on the whole, expect to travel for about ten minutes or less;
- Respondents would expect to spend most time (over 20 minutes) to travel to spaces for children and young people (14%), outdoor sporting facilities (14%), and cemeteries and churchyards (14%);
- In terms of the mode of transport, the results show that respondents tend to walk to the open spaces that are nearest to them and use the car for those that are farthest;
- Respondents are therefore most likely to use the car to spaces for children and young people (21% use cars), outdoor sporting facilities (32%), allotments (32%) and cemeteries and churchyards (46%).

Snap Place Survey 2008/2009

4.45 Introduced in 2008/9, this survey replaces the Best Value Satisfaction, Benefits and Libraries Survey and focuses more on the local area as opposed to the Local Authority and is designed to capture peoples views.

4.46 It showed that overall 47% of respondents were very/fairly satisfied with sport/leisure facilities (57% had used sport/leisure facilities in last year) and 70% were very/fairly satisfied with parks and open spaces with 89% having used parks and open spaces in last year.

4.47 In terms of community safety 43% felt teenagers hanging around street were a very/fairly big problem and in terms of improvements to local areas **activities for teenagers** (55% response) was identified as **most** in need of improvement. This also relates to another finding within the report which shows 43% of respondents felt that teenagers hanging around the streets was a very big problem.

4.48 In terms of over all satisfaction with the local area as a place to live, the response deceased by 1% from 2006/7 to 2008, from 82% to 81% but this still remains fairly high.
